Foreword SWEOLD 2002 codebook

The Swedish Panel Study of Living Conditions of the Oldest Old (SWEOLD) is an extension of the Swedish Level of Living Survey (LNU). The first SWEOLD study was carried out in 1992 and followed up older adults (+75) who had taken part in earlier LNU surveys. The aim of the SWEOLD study was to collect relevant data about the living conditions of older adults and to strengthen the longitudinal aspects of LNU. In 2002 a new wave of data collection were carried out.

The aim of this codebook is to document 2002 data so that they will be as useful as possible for research purposes.

Short history

In 1991 a special level of living-survey aimed at those aged 75 years and above was initiated by Olle Lundberg at the Swedish Institute for Social Research, Stockholm University and Mats Thorslund at the Department of Social Medicine, Academic Hospital in Uppsala. The SWEOLD study was carried out for the first time in the spring of 1992.


The LNU, first conducted in 1968, is one of the longest running longitudinal social science surveys in the world. The survey has continued on a panel-data basis with interview waves in 1974, 1981, 1991 and 2000. Mainly the questionnaires consisted of identical questions in order to study change over time, but improvements have been made on the basis of the experiences of previous surveys. LNU has a multidimensional approach, covering individuals' command over resources in terms of family and social relations, material living conditions (income and wealth), health, education, working conditions, political life, leisure time activities, housing conditions, etc. With the exception of working conditions, most of these areas were included in SWEOLD. In addition, SWEOLD included some items of special importance to older adults, e.g., physical and cognitive health, functional ability, care and activities of daily living.

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The sample design of the Level of Living Survey and SWEOLD

The basis for LNU was a random sample of 1/1000 of the Swedish population aged between 15 and 75. In 1991, the lower age limit was raised to 18 years. In order to maintain representivity, each wave after 1968 consists of three sample groups. The largest group consisted of persons that were included in the previous study. The second group consisted of new persons between 18 and 25 years. The third group consisted of immigrants aged 25 to 75 years who had come to Sweden since the last survey. All studies maintained the age ceiling of 75 years.

SWEOLD 1992

The purpose of the 1992 study was to follow up persons who had participated in earlier LNU surveys in order to create a longitudinal data set including the oldest old. Thereby, it would be possible to relate the living conditions in 1992 for persons aged 77 and older to their living conditions in 1968. SWEOLD focuses on the most prominent welfare problems of older adults. The SWEOLD sample in 1992 included all respondents over the age of 76 who had been interviewed at least once in any of the previous LNU and who were still alive in January 1992. This provided a nationally representative sample of person aged 77-98 years. The response rate was 95.4 percent. The data is documented in a codebook and for a more thorough description of the planning of the fieldwork and the experiences achieved as well as some measurement considerations see Lundberg & Thorslund, 1996 and www.sweold.se.

SWEOLD 2002

In 2002 the second SWEOLD study was carried out. The aim was to increase the knowledge about elderly people's living conditions in the beginning of the 21st century and to keep the longitudinal design. Once again, old people, aged 77 or older, who were living in Sweden in 2002 and who had participated in any of the previous LNU surveys were interviewed. This strategy creates opportunities for both cross-sectional and longitudinal analyses, i.e., individuals can be followed over time from 1968 to 2002.

While SWEOLD 1992 was restricted to persons who had participated in LNU previously, SWEOLD 2002 includes all subjects who were included in the LNU <u>sample</u> and born between 15/3 1892 and 15/12 1925 and still alive and living in Sweden on September 1, 2002 (i.e., even if they did not participate in any previous survey. This full sample consists of 621 respondents.

From the full sample a "panel sample" can be selected by excluding persons never interviewed in any of the previous surveys. This panel sample must be used when SWEOLD 1992 and SWEOLD 2002 are compared. Both the samples are presented in the codebook.

The ambition of the SWEOLD study was to conduct as many face-to-face interviews in person and to carry out as many tests on physical and cognitive ability as possible. If the respondent was temporarily sick or in a hospital, the interview was conducted at a later time. The interviews were usually carried out in the participant's home or in the institutions were they lived. The interviews were based on a structured questionnaire and took approximately one hour.

Telephone interviews were conducted when the participant refused to meet for a face-to-face interview but could accept an interview by telephone. All questions in the questionnaire were asked but the tests of physical and cognitive function were not possible to perform.

Proxy interviews were carried out if the subject where unable to answer all (indirect interview) or some of the questions (mixed interview) directly. The most common reason for a proxy interview was dementia or frailty. Proxies were either close relatives or health care personnel. Information from proxy interviews was included in this study in order to get a complete picture of the living conditions of the very old. For a discussion of both practical and ethical problems in connection with the use of proxy interviews, see Lundberg and Thorslund (1996).

Fieldwork was conducted during the autumn of 2002. The two samples (full and panel) are shown below. The response rate of nearly 89 percent for the panel sample was somewhat lower than 1992. The relatively low non-response rates were obtained primarily because we were able to locate all respondents. The non-responders are therefore refusers.

a) In the full sample 72 of the proxy interviews were conducted by telephone and ten by visit. In the panel sample the corresponding numbers are 62 by telephone and 10 by visit.
b) In the full sample one of the mixed interviews were conducted by telephone and 46 by visit. In the panel sample the corresponding numbers are one by telephone and 43 by visit.

Average interview time for the face-to-face interviews was 72 minutes and 39 minutes for the telephone interviews.

Interviewers in 2002 were equipped with mini-disc recorders. Respondents were asked for their permission to record the interviews. Of the 621 face-to-face interviews, 419 were recorded.

The data collection was supported by grants from the Swedish Research Council (2001-6651). The dataset was approved by the Karolinska Institutet, Ethical Research Committee (508, 03-413).

References

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Codebook SWEOLD 2002

Simple frequencies are given for each item in the questionnaire and for centrally created variables for both the full sample and the panel sample. The design of the codebook largely follows the design used in the LNU and SWEOLD 1992 codebooks. References to comparable variables in SWEOLD 1992 as well as the previous LNU studies are given when available. The variables in LNU 1968 start with the letter W, LNU 1974 with the letter V, LNU 1981 with the letter U, LNU 1991 with Y and LNU 2000 with X. The variables from SWEOLD 1992 were signed with Q.

The codebook has been compiled by Linnea Abramowski, Neda Agahi, Stefan Andersson, Stefan Fors, Sara Hjulström and Dominika Piekut at the Aging Research Center, Karolinska Institutet/Stockholm University. They have organised the data, made the necessary corrections and made decisions about codes for the different type of non-response. They have also been invaluable for careful and efficient work in transforming the data into legible tables and for the layout. Intervjubolaget AB carried out the face-to-face interviews in 2002.

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
